Community and Facility Habilitation

- Consumers attend social, recreational, and volunteer outings
- Consumers develop ties and friendships with each other and also with others in the community.
- Gateway Services collaborates with Franklin College for the Best Buddies Program.
- Facility based services include Day Program, Bingo, and Aktion Club.
- Consumers participate in arts and crafts, life skills, socialization, and other activities.

Supported Employment

- Employment Advisors assist and advocate for individuals through discovering interests and job related skills.
- Employment Advisors work along side individuals when job searching, interviewing, and coaching on the job.
- Individuals can receive assistance beyond the first 90 days with Extended Services.
- Individuals will continue working with their Employment Advisor to develop and enhance skills on the job site.

Transition After School Program

- Teaches high school students aged 16-22 skills they will need to transition from high school to adult roles
- Focuses on vocational skills, financial literacy and budgeting, cooking, laundry, social and adult living skills, and public transportation training.
- Transition Summer Camp is also for students aged 16-22 who would like to enhance social and everyday living skills while having fun.
- Summer Camp operates for two weeks in June and two weeks in July.

Respite
