

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Federal Rule for Swimming Pools & Spas *VIRGINIA GRAEME BAKER POOL & SPA SAFETY ACT*

Dear Pool Operator/Owner:

This is an important notice of a new Federal Act which sets forth requirements that all public and semi-public pools in the U.S should have complied with by <u>December 20, 2008.</u>

In 2007, President Bush signed into Law the "Virginia Graeme Baker Pool & Spa Safety Act of 2007". This Act promotes pool and spa safety by imposing <u>mandatory</u> federal requirements for suction entrapment avoidance. Your public or semi-public pool is included in this mandate.

In August of 2010 the Act was incorporated into the revised Indiana State Department of Health Rule – "Public and Semi-Public Swimming Pools Rule 410 IAC 6-2.1". **The rule is now enforced by the Johnson County Health Department** as well as the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC).

SUMMARY Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act

In summary, the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act effective **December 20, 2008** requires:

- Each public pool and spa, both new and existing, must be equipped with drain covers conforming to the <u>ASME/ANSI A112.19.8 2007 Standard</u>.
- Each public pool and spa in the United States with a single main drain other than an unblockable drain be equipped, at a minimum, with 1 or more of the following devices or systems designed to prevent entrapment by pool or spa drains:
 - A safety vacuum release system which ceases operation of the pump, reverses the circulation flow, or otherwise provides a vacuum release at a suction outlet when a blockage is detected, that has been tested by an independent third party and found to conform to <u>ASME/ANSI</u> standard A112.19.17 or <u>ASTM standard F2387</u>.
 - A suction-limiting vent system with a tamper-resistant atmospheric opening.
 - A gravity drainage system that utilizes a collector tank.
 - An automatic pump shut-off system.
 - A device or system that disables the drain.
 - Any other system approved by the Consumer Product Safety Commission to ASME/ANSI standard A112.19.17 or ASTM standard F2387.

Safety Drain Covers. Each swimming pool or spa drain cover manufactured, distributed, or entered into commerce in the United States shall conform to the American National Standard <u>ASME/ANSI</u> <u>A112.19.8 - 2007</u> Suction Fittings for Use in Swimming Pools, Wading Pools, Spas, and Hot Tubs published by the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME). Compliance with this Standard will be enforced by the Consumer Product Safety Commission.
