# Policy for Paternity Affidavit:

Paternity may be established at

- 1. Local Health Dept (\$50.00 + \$12.00 for Birth Certificate)
- 2. Prosecutor's office
- 3. Court

Always check and make sure that there has not been a PA already signed.

#### ID Needed:

- 1. Picture ID (current)
  - ✓ State Issued photo ID
  - ✓ Military ID or State ID
  - ✓ Valid passport
  - ✓ Dept. of Correction ID
  - ✓ School ID with picture and signature
  - ✓ Court order (order must order local health dept. to release record to person named on record.)
  - ✓ For Affidavit upon Marriage, A MARRIAGE LICENSE MUST BE PRESENTED.
  - ✓ Genetic test results filing for joint custody (and is within 60 days after child's birth).

#### If there is no Picture ID we will need **TWO** of these:

- ✓ Police report (for reported stolen ID)
- ✓ Fire report (for record that are destroyed in fire)
- ✓ Vehicle registration with signature & SS #
- ✓ Welfare, food stamp or WIC ID cards
- ✓ Voter's registration card
- ✓ Application of marriage license
- ✓ Baptismal certificate
- ✓ Birth record of children
- ✓ Employment records
- ✓ High School Diploma (copy is acceptable)
- ✓ Hospital record of birth
- ✓ Life insurance policies (includes name of company, policy # and date of issuance
- ✓ Military discharge papers
- ✓ Court order

## ALL IDENTIFICATION MUST BE CURRENT

### Procedure:

- 1. Get all identification and copy.
- 2. Give them the application form to fill out.
- 3. After ID is taken and form filled out, go to Paternity Affidavit template and complete.
- 4. Give draft to each to look over, make corrections.
  - At this point they are to be separated to different areas to look over.
- 5. If they are filing for JOINT CUSTODY they will need paternity testing results within 60 days of child's birth.
- 6. Put date of viewed test results on PA application. We will not keep any DNA test results.
- 7. We will keep PA for 60 days after which "Custody Section" will be void if DNA test are not presented.

- 8. If the child is more than 60 days old they MAY NOT FILE FOR JOINT CUSTODY.
- 9. If the parent would like legal advice, give them a "Sample Copy" they may take it elsewhere to look it over. We cannot give legal advice. If the "Sample Copy" is signed when they bring it back in. <u>Paternity Affidavit must be filled out, signed and notarized *in office*</u>. Otherwise they need to go to another agency to have it done.
- 10. Notarize, make copies for both parents
- 11. Send original to the State, keep a copy and attach to birth certificate.
