To: New Tattoo/Body Piercer Owner or Operator

Re: License Procedures for New Tattoo/Body Piercing Shops

All persons engaged in tattoo and body piercing operations in Johnson County are required to operate in a licensed and inspected facility by the Johnson County Health Department. Mobile or temporary operations are not permitted in Johnson County.

This packet is designed to describe basic requirements necessary to obtain a facility license in Johnson County. Once obtained the license may be renewed annually. The normal license cycle runs from January 1 through December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year.

- 1. Prior to obtaining your license the proposed shop must be inspected by this Department for compliance with applicable state and local rules. In addition written assurances must be presented that indicate compliance with proper zoning, fire codes, taxing entities, and building codes under relevant jurisdictions.
- 2. If your operation utilizes reusable piercing equipment or reusable ink tubes for tattoo machine(s), an autoclave unit will be required to sterilize. The autoclave must be tested via a spore test from a certified laboratory prior to opening and then at least one time per month. In all shops an EPA registered tuberculocidal disinfectant cleaner is required as well as disposable gloves, single use razors, adequate lighting, separate hand-sinks in each artist's booth, and sanitary facilities.
- 3. Inspectors are available to provide more detailed information and make pre-opening inspections of your proposed facility.
